

Kelley Retires as Postmaster; Guay Is Named

MANITOWOC — The U. S. Postal Service Friday announced that Harry J. Kelley, 612 N. Sixth St., is retiring as Manitowoc's postmaster, effective Sunday.

Gene J. Guay, postmaster at Peshtigo, will succeed Kelley as officer in charge of the postoffice.

Kelley, then Second Ward alderman, was appointed postmaster here in June, 1951, at the age of 35. He succeeded his father, Atty. Harry F. Kelley, as head of the Manitowoc post office.

Kelley, a native of Manitowoc, was graduated from Lincoln High School and received his degree in business administration at the University of Wisconsin in 1938.

Served in Navy

After working in the accounting department at the Manitowoc Ship Building Inc., for about two years, he entered the U. S. Navy early in World War II, serving for three years as a supply corps officer. Kelley spent more than a year as supply officer aboard an attack transport in the Pacific theatre, leaving the navy as a lieutenant (j.g.)

He was serving his second term as Second Ward alderman when appointed postmaster.

Kelley is a member and has held office in various civic, religious and business organizations.

Mr. and Mrs. Kelley, the former Dorothy Fetzer, are the parents of four daughters and two sons.
